- *Studies show that the presence of animals tends to lessen tension and anxiety.*

The program will culminate in a visit to Tirhatuan Park Reserve to undertake water quality tests under the supervision of Melbourne Water staff.

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Line Marking

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Prep to Year 4 Swimming Program, 2022

We are pleased to announce that our Swimming Program for Prep to Year 4 will be held each day from the beginning of Term 2, Tuesday 26th April (first day of term) to Friday 6th May. Our program takes place at **Swimworld Pool**, Springvale Road in Glen Waverley. Further details are provided in a letter to families available through Operoo.

Swimming caps have been made available for all students by the St Justin's Sports captains throughout this week and will be available for purchase for the rest of this term. Swimming caps are compulsory for this program. Please send \$2 in a sealed envelope with details on the front to your child's teacher and they will be provided with one.

Again this year, due to continuing COVID restrictions, we are only permitted two parent helpers per class and visitors are not permitted to watch at the pool. Parents wishing to support the program must have a current working with children check and have also completed the St Justin's Child Safety / Volunteer process. New parents wishing to help can download the forms from the St Justin's website, under Child Safety, leave these at the school office and either Mr Patrick Torpey or Mrs Annie Herbison will make contact with you to undertake an interview.

- Have you assisted with the swimming program in the past (this is not a requirement for doing so this year)
- Have you got a current Working with Children Check
- Have you completed the St Justin's Volunteer process

- Do you have your own transport (parents need to meet the class at the pool as you are not able to travel on the bus with the class)

Please note, at this stage, all parent helpers will need to wear a mask at the pool and show vaccination status upon entry.

Please note, payment for the Swimming program has already been covered in school levies, so you do not have to make a separate payment for this.

Please be advised that all parents/carers/guardians who have been contacted to come onsite to collect a sick/injured child must sign their child out and wait in the front office for your child to be brought out to you. Last week we rolled out the table tennis tables into the Undercover Area – it didn't take long before we had a few games going on. The table tennis tables will be set up each Thursday.





WELLBEING NEWS

What a whirlwind the first 6 weeks have been - we are happy to see the children starting to settle into routines and find themselves within old and new friendship groups. We acknowledge that there is still a way to go, we can't lose sight of the fact that the past 2 years have been incredibly tumultuous for everyone, especially our young people.



While school is quickly becoming normal again and children are adjusting to routines and expectations, recent local and global events, as well as the continuing pandemic, have left many of us feeling uncertain and anxious. When children are feeling anxious, it can be quite stressful for the adults around them - we want to help but often are unsure where to start! Below are some helpful tips from the wonderful picture storybook **“How Big Are Your Worries Little Bear”** by Janeen Sanders that offer a great starting point for helping young people identify and manage their anxious feelings.

- It is important to acknowledge how a child is feeling and reassure them you are there for them and they are safe. Give them time to process their feelings and listen as they share their worries. If children are anxious about a certain event, talk through the process of the event with them - what will happen before, during and after the event.
- Tell children to be “bossy” with their worries. Encourage children to verbalise worries using phrases such as “Go away” or “I don't have to listen to you”.
- Explain what happens physically when you are anxious and what is going on in your brain during these times. There are some great picture storybooks to help introduce and explain brain function to children, including “Hey Warrior” by Karen Young.
- Mindfulness - being conscious of the here and now, is a wonderful way children can distance themselves from their worries. [Smiling Mind](#) offer fantastic mindfulness meditations for children and there are some incredible clips on youtube with guided meditations and breathing exercises children can practice.



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Stewardship

This week the Students of our School (SOOS) began a 4 week program learning about the urban water cycle and how to keep Dandenong Creek pollution free. The education team from Melbourne Water presented an informative session with images and maps of our local area showing all the water catchments, underground pipes, dams, and reservoirs that show how our water is collected and moved around to our households. There was a 3D model of a topographic map of the urban water cycle showing how rainwater travels from the bush to the city. Photos and thoughts from the year 4s have been shared on Seesaw. Here are some photos of their experiences.



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Keira, Kim, Olivia and Alice made the following comments:

- We learnt that most of the water flows from mountains
- Only 3% of water is drinking water
- We are losing animals very fast due to human litter
- Marine animals are affected due to storm water washing rubbish into their habitats. They can mistake it as food.
- There are multiple trash pick-up stations to keep litter from spreading through the ocean, lakes and more bodies of water.
- The creek model showed us how the creek moves and how Dandenong creek works.

The students were very interested and demonstrated great respect towards our visitors and are looking forward to next week.

In the veggie patch there have been some surprising harvests - in particular our zucchini discovered today by Mrs Cedro! We were very impressed with its size - we cannot guarantee its taste but we will enjoy exploring its use when zucchini muffins are made next week! The pumpkins continue to grow to the delight of the year 3 caretakers. Mrs Cedro spent quite a few hours in the garden today and harvested the remaining tomatoes and sunflowers. Lettuce and radish were sown today and should be ready in about 6 weeks.

Our chickens continue to provide us with eggs and friendship. Many thanks go to Mrs Stewart and her reliable team of helpers who are only too willing to undertake this care in their own time.

Clean Up Australia Day

Clean up Australia Day (CUAD) occurs on the first Sunday of March each year. The focus today is as much on preventing rubbish entering our environment as it is removing what has already accumulated. One way we can all contribute is to continue to reduce our food waste in the classroom bins, thereby reducing the amount ending up in landfill. Students are being encouraged to eat the food provided from home, and any food uneaten, half eaten or food scraps return home in their lunch box. They can then dispose of the food using their home waste system. From time to time we will collect food scraps for our school compost system. Being responsible for our own waste and mess is a challenge but also a great teaching moment of responsibility, independence and accountability. I encourage you to watch the short video provided by Monash council on how food and garden waste go together. We hope this activity gives your family a chance to discuss what kindness means to you and how every one of us has the power to introduce a little kindness into our world.

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


Wednesday 23rd March 2022

The students will be treated to a performance of The Maths Mindset Show - A 'live' show that helps students build a positive Maths mindset, defeat Maths anxiety, and build their confidence in Maths.



There will also be lots of fun activities planned for the students to participate in!

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COVID Reminder

- *Rapid antigen surveillance testing will continue until the end of Term 1, with all primary school students and staff recommended to test at home twice a week (Monday and Wednesday preferably for St Justin's). Our latest RATs will be sent home as soon as they arrive - for students who are absent on distribution day, we will hold them in the student's classroom until their return.*
- *Covid-positive results need to be reported to:*
 - *Department of Health system ([Rapid antigen tests | Coronavirus Victoria](#)) or via the coronavirus hotline at 1800 675 398.*
 - *School by phone (9561 7644) or written notification office@sjwheelershill.catholic.edu.au; so the school can support them, record that they will be absent while in 7-day isolation, and let the rest of the school community know there has been a positive case onsite and that they should monitor for symptoms.*
- *Students and staff who have tested positive for COVID-19, have completed their 7-day isolation period and are subsequently asymptomatic do not need to undertake surveillance testing for 30 days.*
- *QR code check-in requirements will no longer be in place in schools.*
- *Visitors over 8 years of age are expected to wear a mask when they enter a school building (unless and exemption applies).*
- *Students in Years 3 to Year 6 are required to wear a mask when indoors (unless and exemption applies). **Can we please ensure that a mask is sent from home.***
- *Students in Years Prep – Year 2 are encouraged to wear a mask.*

Home Learning Packages

As many will now be aware, Home Learning tasks are made available to students who are required to isolate due to being a COVID close contact. These tasks are also available to children isolating if they have contracted COVID, if they are well enough to do so. Home Learning has been designed so that students can continue practising skills they need at their level of ability. The tasks are not required to be completed by students who are at home for 1-2 days with other illnesses.

It is not expected that your child completes every task in the pack. However if they are managing well and are able to do so, of course they can. All year levels are presenting these tasks in different ways. Some are paper based and supplied when required, others are pushed out through Seesaw, Google Classroom or email. You will need to make contact with your child's teacher to work with them as to what is best for your child.

One of the most important things to do while your child is at home is to find time to play board games and card games with them and practise daily reading. Many problem solving skills and higher order thinking can be gained through board games requiring strategic thinking. Having discussions about texts after reading and asking all the W-questions... Who, What, Where, When assists a child with comprehension. To

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take them further, ask WHY questions... Why do you think that? What evidence in the text has brought you to that conclusion? OR How might you have finished the story differently if you were the author? Why?

The classroom teacher needs to be made aware so they will know what they can set, based on what is happening with your child. Please make contact with your child's teacher about informing them of the situation and about accessing the Home Learning via email.

Volunteering at St Justin's

St Justin's Primary School seeks to provide a safe, open and nurturing learning environment for all students. The school acknowledges the value that volunteers play in a variety of learning, school based and community activities and actively encourages their participation.

To ensure the safety and wellbeing and protection of all students, St Justin's Parish Primary School, ensures that all of our policies and practices embed a child-safe culture that has zero tolerance for child abuse. Our recruitment, screening, induction, ongoing monitoring and assessment for volunteers align with our Child Safety Policy and our Child Safety Code of Conduct and adhere to the requirements of Clause 10 of Ministerial Order No. 870 (Volunteers).



St Justin's Primary School takes its commitment to maintaining a 'child safe' environment for all students and young people seriously and implores that all members of the school community, including volunteers, work with us to achieve this.

A volunteer is defined as any unpaid individual who provides support in educational, sporting, extra curricula or school community activities to the school. Their assistance is provided under the direction and supervision of identified school representatives.

Any parent who wishes to volunteer their services to the school must ensure they participate in the school's volunteer screening and induction procedures.

All volunteers must:

- Provide evidence (driver's license/Medicare card/passport) of personal identity*
- Provide a valid Working with Children Check (WWCC)*
- Respond to Volunteer Application questions*
- Complete two Referee Reports for Volunteers that affirm that volunteer's suitability for working with children*
- Meet with the Principal and/or Deputy Principal as part of our regular interview process. A Record of Interview will be completed at this time.*

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CAMP SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND

This is a Victorian Government initiative which provides payments to schools for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions. The amount payable for eligible primary students is \$125 and for those students this amount will be used to reduce their school fees.

To be eligible to receive the payment a parent or legal guardian of a student must on the first days of Terms 1 or 2 be an eligible beneficiary, who hold's a Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC), Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) or a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, or be a temporary foster parent and submit an application to the school.

Please collect an application form from the school office, complete and return as soon as possible. Payments will be made directly to schools from March 2021. Once received, these payments will be credited to school fees.

Any parent who applied for, and received, the CSEF last year IS NOT REQUIRED to submit a new form this year.

FEES & LEVIES Q & A

We have had some common queries regarding Fees and the Fees & Levies Invoices so here's a quick Q&A to explain.

Q. *Our old statements showed how much we had to pay each term. How do I know how much to pay per term?*

A. *If you divide the total of your 2022 Fees by 3 that will be your payment due in each of Terms 1, 2 & 3.*

Q. *Why is the fees & levies statement different to previous year?*

A. *With the change of system to ICON, the Statements now itemise the Fees & Levies so that you can clearly see how your fees are broken down.*

Q. *Why does the fee statement have Anne-Maree's email address on it?*

A. *The Fees statements were incorrectly issued with this address and the statements issued in Semester 2 will have the correct address shown. Please note - all fees queries should come to office@sjwheelershill.catholic.edu.au*

Q. *How do I get a Direct Debit Form?*

A. *We can send one home with your child or email one through to you*

2022 Student Residential Address and Other Information

The Australian Government Department of Education, Skills and Employment (the department) would like to notify you that a request has been made for your child's school to provide residential address and other information as required under the *Australian Education Regulation 2013*.

The school is required to provide the department with the following information about each student at the school:

- Names and residential addresses of student's parent(s) and/or guardian(s)
- Student residential address (**excluding student names**)
- Whether the student is a primary or secondary student (education level)
- Whether the student is boarding or a day student (boarding status).

The school collects the above information by generating a **unique and unidentifiable** – student reference number (SRN) for each student record. The SRN is also **only** used by the school for this collection. **It is not allowed to be used for any other purpose.** The number only indicates to the department that each record provided is for one student.

Purpose of the collection

The Student Residential Address and Other Information Collection (the Collection) informs Australian Government school education policy and helps ensure funding for non-government schools is based on need basis.

The information collected will be used to inform school funding calculations. It is combined with data held by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) to calculate a non-government school community's anticipated capacity to contribute to the costs of schooling.

From 2020, a new measure of capacity to contribute, the Direct Measure of Income (DMI), was introduced. The DMI is based on the median income of parents or guardians of students at a non-government school using data collected through the Collection. More information about the DMI can be found on the [Quality Schools Package](#) page on the departmental website.

Use and disclosure of personal information

Your personal information is protected by law under the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) (Privacy Act). Personal information is information or an opinion about an identifiable individual. Personal information includes an individual's name and contact details.

Any use or disclosure of your personal information must occur in accordance with Privacy Act and the *Australian Education Act 2013* and *Australian Education Regulation 2013*.

Your personal information provided to the department through the Collection may be:

- disclosed to the ABS for the purposes of capacity to contribute calculations and analysis as a part of the Multi-Agency Data Integration Project (MADIP). Further information about MADIP can be found on the [MADIP page](#) on the ABS website.
- disclosed to a contracted auditor where the department may from time to time, carry out an audit of a school's submission to the Collection. The contracted auditor compares the school's submission with the student enrolment information held by the school and will not use the information for any other purpose.
- disclosed to its service providers for the purposes of the provision of information and communications technology support services to the department.
- used or disclosed where it is otherwise required or authorised by law.

The department does not intend to disclose your personal information to any overseas recipients.

The department's privacy policy can be found at www.dese.gov.au and includes information on:

- how individuals can access and seek correction of the personal information held by the department;
- how complaints about potential breaches or breaches of the Privacy Act can be made;
- how the department will deal with these complaints.

The department commissioned an independent privacy impact assessment (PIA). The PIA assesses the flows of information under the Collection, compliance with the Privacy Act and measures in place to safeguard the personal information being collected. You are not required to do anything. Your school is responsible for providing the requested details to the department; however, you may wish to ensure that your school has the most up-to-date and correct details for your family.

NCCD Information Sheet for Parents, Carers and Guardians

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) On School Students with Disability

What is the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data?

Schools must now complete the *Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)* every year. It counts the number of students who receive additional adjustments or "help" at school because of a disability. The NCCD helps governments plan for the needs of students with disability.

Who is counted in the data collection?

To count a student in the NCCD, schools must think through some key questions:

1. Is the student getting help at school so that they can take part in education on the same basis as other students?
2. Is the help given because of a disability? The word 'disability' comes from the [Disability Discrimination Act 1992](#) (DDA) and it can include many students.
3. Has the school talked to you or your child about the help that they provide?
4. Has the school kept records about the help they provide, the student needs and the reasons that the student needs this help? The school will need to keep copies of tests, student work, assessments, records of meetings, medical reports or other paperwork and information about how the student's learning is moving along over time.

Once the school decides that the student should be counted in the NCCD, they then choose a disability group and one of four levels of help that has been given to the student.

What does the word 'disability' mean in the NCCD?

In the NCCD the word 'disability' comes from the [Disability Discrimination Act 1992](#) (DDA). There are four types of disability that the school can choose from: sensory, cognitive, social-emotional and physical.

Many students that need help at school can be counted in the NCCD. For example, students with learning problems, e.g. specific learning disability or reading difficulty (sometimes called dyslexia), health problems (e.g. epilepsy or diabetes), physical disability (e.g. cerebral palsy), vision/hearing loss and social-emotional problems (e.g. selective mutism, Autism Spectrum Disorder, anxiety).

Letters from doctors or specialists can be very helpful for schools as they plan how to support students with their learning. Schools do not need to have these letters before they can count a

student in NCCD. Teachers can use all that they know about the student's learning and the records that they have collected over time to decide if a student can be counted in the NCCD.

What sort of help does the school give students?

Students need different types of help at school. Some students need a little help sometimes while other students need a lot of help nearly all the time. The type of help given depends on the needs of the student. The help can include changes to the school buildings or grounds (e.g. ramps or things like special desks or chairs), extra teacher help in classes, special learning programs, changes to the work they give the student or extra adult help.

How will the NCCD be different this year?

All schools have been counting students in the NCCD since 2015. The government will use the NCCD data as part of the funding to schools.

What will the school need to know about my child for the NCCD?

Schools work together with families to understand the needs of each child. It is helpful if families give their child's teacher a copy of any letters or reports they have. The letters or reports will help the school understand the child and the help that they might need. Letters from doctors, psychologists, speech pathologists, doctor, and occupational therapists etc. can be very helpful for schools. These reports along with information that the teacher has (i.e. school based tests, your child's work and learning plans) helps the school to understand and meet your child's needs.

What happens to the NCCD data? Who will have the NCCD information?

Each school principal must check the NCCD data in August of each year. The school will give the information to the Catholic Education Office. The school will work with the Catholic Education Office to make sure that the NCCD data is OK before they give the data to the government. The government will not be given the names of any students or any letters or records. Please ask your school for their privacy policy if you need to know more.

Does the school need me to agree with them about counting my child in the NCCD?

Amendments were made to the [Australian Education Act 2013](#) and [Australian Education Regulation 2013](#). Schools do not need you to agree to let them count a child in the NCCD. You cannot ask the school not to count your child.
