School Fees 2022

This week a letter went home to all families advising of the school fees for 2022. Please note that there is a slight change – the Tuition Fee for both One Child Families and Families with more than one child, already includes the Maintenance Fee of \$100. Please see below the adjusted fee schedule:

Plans for 2022

As announced in previous newsletters, plans for 2022 are well and truly underway. Whilst for many of us our attention is on Christmas and the end of the school year, it's amazing how much work has already gone into preparing for the 2022 school year. Most of our enrolments for 2022 are set, although we are still receiving one or two enquiries.

At this stage we plan to have 14 classes. With a class average of 23 students, plus support staff, this structure allows for growth and student movement and provides opportunities for teachers to work in teams. Students and teachers will work closely, especially in levels, sharing spaces and strengths when appropriate. It is important to remember that all teachers have other administration duties alongside their classroom responsibilities, which will require them to be released on an ongoing basis.

As indicated in previous newsletters, we have already given a great deal of thought to the placement of each child – a decision that is not taken lightly. We endeavour to provide each child with the opportunity to be part of a class that will allow him or her the best opportunity to learn. Consideration is given to each child's social and emotional needs, ability, behaviour, etc. Individual needs and a whole school perspective must be considered. However, having said that, with our connecting classrooms accessed via sliding doors and moveable walls, our students are more able to engage and interact with students and teachers from other classes.

We are a community of learners and we learn for, from and with each other. This includes us all and not just a selection. It is exposure to a variety of personalities and qualities that help us develop as a whole person. Life is sometimes not about being in the perfect situation, but making the most of the situation we are in.

With many goals still to be achieved until the end of the school year, we will continue with our plans for 2022.

Staffing

As announced in previous newsletters, at the end of this year, Mrs Anne-Maree Smith and Mrs Annette Melenhorst will finish up at St Justin's. Today, we are sad to say that Mr Frank Davis will finish up also as our Grounds Person. Mr Davis has been with us since 2010 and as a grounds person, Frank has become a great bus driver, chicken wrangler, footy coach and mentor, sign writer, furniture removalist, painter, book exchange coordinator, story teller, leaf blower operator (just to name a few) but most importantly, he's become a dear friend who will be greatly missed. I'm sure we'll continue to see him for regular visits. We thank Mr Davis for his many contributions and wish him all the very best as he continues on his life journey.

You will note that in the office we welcome Mrs Belinda Rubino to our team. Currently, Mrs Rubino works with NAB Monday to Wednesday as an Expertise Customer Service Adviser and Facilitator, which involves a variety of administrative roles in the National Call Centre, using up to twelve software applications throughout the day. She also spends a great deal of her time volunteering and contributing to the community and her children's sport, evidenced by the coordination of gala nights and convening dance competitions. We certainly welcome Mrs Rubino who I'm sure will be a wonderful asset to our team.

We are also excited to announce that Mrs Laura Wegmann and Mrs Jen McGrath will share the role of STEAM Specialist Teachers for 2022 (formerly IRC). STEAM combines the curriculum areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics and will bring together learning linked to the class

Mrs Wegmann will lead the work in the library to maintain it as a central resource for us all. I'm sure with Mrs Wegmann and Mrs McGrath's enthusiasm, adaptability and energy, and the support from us all, we are destined to see great things. We wish them both well.

You will also notice that Miss Laura Leung will take on the role as Literacy Leader for 2022. We know both Literacy and Numeracy are huge roles, but there are many areas that cross over and we have so many "knowledgeable others" who I know will continue to support our leaders, each other and our students.


Christmas Cheer

Year 4 Stewardship Program



Registration is FREE!

To attend our care, families must register their child.

Why? Registering your child means we have all the information we need to safely care for them. So, we recommend all families to register an account with us. That way, if you ever need us, you just have to book a session, as we already have all the documentation we need from you.

To register, visit campaustralia.com.au. When starting your registration process, please consider:

- Do you have a Customer Reference Number (CRN) from the Department of Human Services?
- Does your child have any medical certificates/documents?
- Medical information - do you have details of your family doctor?
- Do you have any Court Order documents?

Also ensure:

- You have your payment details at hand
- You have your Child Immunisation Certificates ready to upload

But don't worry, you can always resume your saved registration at a time that suits you.



We recommend to always book in advance.

To secure your children's spot, we encourage you to make your bookings in advance. As we operate a childcare service governed by the Education and Care National Law and Regulations, we can only operate our services within Educator to child ratios and licensed space. The more notice we have on bookings, the better able we are to staff the service to meet your needs.

It is easy to make and manage your bookings 24/7 through our Parent Portal or Parent Portal smartphone app. Simply log onto pp.campaustralia.com.au or head over to your native app store and search for Camp Australia.

Alternatively, you can call our friendly Customer Care Team on 1300 105 343. The team are available from 5am - 9pm, 7 days a week - Except National Public Holidays.

Child Care Subsidy

Did you know you can reduce the cost of care with a Government subsidy?

We strongly recommend you apply for the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) to determine whether you're eligible. Your eligibility for the subsidy is determined by:

- Your family's annual adjusted taxable income
- An activity test
- The type of childcare service
