
### ***Ash Wednesday***



- *Complete two Referee Reports for Volunteers that affirm that volunteer's suitability for working with children*
- *Meet with the Principal and/or Deputy Principal as part of our regular interview process. A Record of Interview will be completed at this time.*

*Children are able to return and borrow from the library at the following times when they come with their classroom teacher -*


*Monday: Year 6, Year 4 & Year 2. Thursday: Preps. Friday: Year 1, Year 3 & Year 5.*

We also encourage children to be responsible for their borrowed books.*

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
As the song says, 'SING HALLELUJAH!'

They are already in full swing attending to our compost procedures and will have much to do this year to continue to drive sustainable practices in our community. Coming up on 5th March is Schools Clean Up Australia Day. Fortunately our school remains a very clean environment partly due to the fact that we do not take any food outside for eating. We will have some suggestions on how we will address this initiative in the future.

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### **Marine Ambassadors**

*The Marine Ambassadors: Lexi, Krystal, Thomas and Nicholas are looking forward with fingers crossed to their first excursion into learning more about our marine environment and how important our waterways are to our planet. They will report back on their experience to our school community and share their message about how we can all help to keep our waterways clean.*

### **Kitchen Garden**

*Next week the year 4 students begin their Kitchen Garden experience. The students will be making food, craft and garden produce over their 5 week program, culminating in a mini market where we will put our wares on display.*

### **Yr 4 Stewardship Program**

*The year 4 students have spent each Thursday afternoon involved in this new initiative for our school where they are taking on the role of Stewards - caretakers of our school environment. Today we discussed our collected specimens from our walk last week and wondered what these items reveal about our school land. For example, some interesting coloured feathers were found indicating there is colourful birdlife in this area. Next week the students will be brainstorming ways to use the land in creative and sustainable ways for the common good.*



*Meanwhile in our school vegie garden, the sunflowers have warmly welcomed us to the start of the year with their sunny smiley faces towering over our garden beds. We have collected lots of tomatoes, some zucchini, beans, and planted radishes, lettuce, cucumber and peas. We have also sown seeds that we will plant in the garden once they have germinated and are a bit stronger.*

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*This week let's talk about resilience.*


*Resilience is the capacity to recover quickly from difficulties. Sometimes it's called mental toughness.*

*2020 and 2021 have really tested the limits of everyone's resilience, both adults and children, in many different ways.*

*Resilience is a term we often use when talking with our students, we encourage them to "be resilient and keep going", but I often think do they actually know what we mean?*

*In simple terms, resilience is the ability to cope when things go wrong. It's 'bouncing back' after a difficult time, dealing with challenges and keeping your head held high.*

*Resilience requires a growth mindset too, you have to be willing and able to have a go, try your best and be able to cope with whatever may come your way, acknowledging it, accepting it and moving on from it.*




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As funny as it sounds, you can learn to be resilient, and we can encourage our children to develop this trait, by:

- Helping them to solve problems they face independently. While it is distressing for us to see our children feeling discomfort, this is actually an important feeling to know as it will encourage kids to find ways out of it, leading to the development of problem-solving skills.
- Spending one-on-one time with our children, talking and forging a strong emotional bond. These positive connections allow adults to model positive problem-solving and coping skills as well as



providing children a sense of empowerment to seek guidance and make attempts to work through difficult situations.

- Promoting healthy risk-taking. A “healthy risk” is something that encourages a child to try something outside their comfort zone but results in very little harm if they are unsuccessful.
- When children approach you with a problem, rather than try and solve it for them, ask questions. This will encourage your child to think through the problem rather than look for the ‘quick fix’. Brainstorm possible solutions together, demonstrating to children your own problem-solving skills and helping them to see they have someone to help them when they need it.
- Label emotions and help children to name their own emotions as this will encourage them to understand what they are feeling. Demonstrate coping skills such as deep breathing, to help children remain calm and centered and more likely to work through a problem and move on than become overwhelmed.

Embrace mistakes (both your own and your child's), promoting a positive growth mindset and helping children understand we can learn from mistakes - they can be something positive!

- EXERCISE! It helps strengthen the brain and make it more resilient to stress and adversity.

If Covid has taught us anything, it's that the ability to be resilient and bounce back when things don't go our way is one trait that will impact positively on our lives, in unsure and uncertain times.

### **CAMP SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND**

This is a Victorian Government initiative which provides payments to schools for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions. The amount payable for eligible primary students is \$125 and for those students this amount will be used to reduce their school fees.

To be eligible to receive the payment a parent or legal guardian of a student must on the first days of Terms 1 or 2 be an eligible beneficiary, who hold's a Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC), Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) or a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, or be a temporary foster parent and submit an application to the school.

Please collect an application form from the school office, complete and return as soon as possible. Payments will be made directly to schools from March 2021. Once received, these payments will be credited to school fees.

**Any parent who applied for, and received, the CSEF last year IS NOT REQUIRED to submit a new form this year.**




